

2 DETAILS OF THE APPLICANT, THE ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT PRACTITIONER AND THE DECISION-MAKING AUTHORITY

2.1 Introduction

This section of the **Revised Draft** EIR provides the particulars of the Applicant, the Environmental Assessment Practitioner (EAP) and the relevant decision-making authority.

2.2 Details of Applicant

The Eskom Conversion Act, 2001 (Act No. 13 of 2001) established Eskom Holdings Limited (Eskom) as a State-Owned Enterprise, with the Government of South Africa as the only shareholder, represented by the Minister of Public Enterprises. According to the Memorandum of Association required by the Eskom Conversion Act and the Companies Act, 1973 (Act No. 61 of 1973), Eskom's main objective is to "provide energy and related services including the generation, transmission, distribution and supply of electricity, and to hold interests in other entities."

Eskom is regulated under licences granted by *inter alia* the **National Electricity Regulator of South Africa** (NERSA) and the **National Nuclear Regulator** (NNR) (Eskom 2007). Eskom is a vertically integrated operation that generates, transmits and distributes electricity. Eskom generates approximately 95 % of the electricity used in South Africa.
