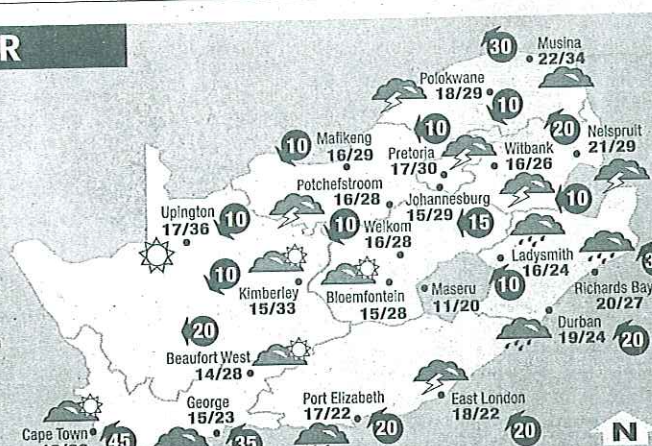

MAIN FORECAST

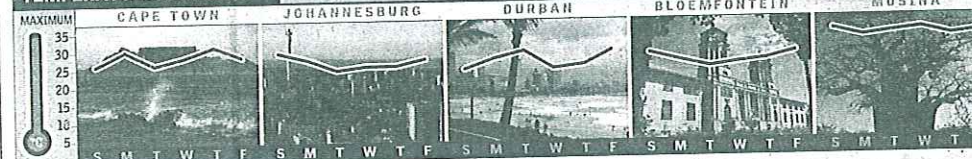

Koeberg set for shutdowns

KOEBERG nuclear power station will be forced to shut down both reactors over the next three weeks to repair leaking pipes.

Eskom spokesman Tony Stott said maintenance would be carried out at power stations around the country earlier than usual to ensure a stable electricity supply for the World Cup.

Both units at the Koeberg nuclear power station in the Western Cape will undergo shutdowns to repair the rubber lining of the steel pipes used to carry sea water to cool some of the components inside the station.

Instead of fixing the problem during Koeberg's next refuelling outage, Stott said that they would shut down unit one over the long weekend to complete the repairs.

Unit two would then be shut down over the Easter weekend for similar repairs.

"This is not the system that cools down the reactor — that is an independent system," he said.

The long weekends were chosen because electricity demand was lower.

Stott said that he did not expect power shortages during that time. — Nashira Davids
